## **SECRETARY REPORT**



## **JUNIOR CRICKET REPORT**



This past season saw yet another wonderful season for the junior players at the club. We had strong registrations across all age groups in our Junior programs - nearly 100 kids registered.

#### Pre-season

Before the start of last season, the club ran the Joeys Program – a holistic program designed to encourage our young players to adopt healthy habits and good training strategies. This was ably led by Steve McVie and Brendan Alderson and was attended by more than 20 players. Professional physios and sports psychologists were brought in to present and lead discussions with the players. Very positive feedback was received on this program. This program will be run again next season with a different format.

#### Registrations

The club ran two levels of the Blasters Program, a stage 2 Girls team, one U10s side, two U12 sides, one U14 side, one u16 side and a Youth League side. We were really excited to pair up with Warnervale to put together a combined U12 side.

#### **Season Results**

Four of our junior teams made it into the semi-finals: both U12 teams, the U14s and the Youth League team. The Youth League side was also the minor premiers of their competition. The U12 Navy team and the Youth League team both made it to their respective finals, but unfortunately, both lost in tough games.

#### **Player Performances**

There have been some fantastic individual performances from many players throughout the season. 22 Wyong Junior Roos were selected for representative cricket across Youth Championships and Carnival Teams. That's almost 40% of eligible Junior Roos who played some format of Rep Cricket for the Central Coast Cricket Association. This is an outstanding representation!

We are very proud of the results from all of our teams. If you look at the numbers, we are one of the most successful junior programs on the Coast.

#### **Next Season**

The club looks forward to another great summer ahead in season 23/24 and we are anticipating an increase in junior numbers, particularly in the Blasters program.

Across the entire season, we managed to field the below;

- 8 teams in the senior men's competition.
- 2 teams in the senior women's.

- A T20 Team, and a Masters Team (Over 40s).

Throughout the season, we only forfeited 2 rounds due to player unavailability, which I think was a great achievement due to how many players we had out on some weeks.

In all we used 120 senior men, 21 women and 21 juniors to field our Senior teams week in, week out.

I would like to give a special mention to the junior players and their parents for helping out and backing up after their morning game. Mums and Dads, thank you for getting them to the senior games quickly, and in some cases, travelling from one end of the coast to another. Without our Juniors and their parents, we would of surely forfeited a lot more games.

I'm looking forward to running as Senior Cricket Co-Ordinator again in 2023/24.
